Marriage license – name change info: You can obtain your marriage license at the Clerk & Recorder's Office of any county in the state. It's best if you can both go to the county and have your driver's license with you. No other ID is required. Please inquire with the county where you intend to obtain your marriage license, as to additional requirements that might be needed.

Note to bride: There is inconsistency with various counties as to whether you sign the marriage license with your maiden name or your married name. The truth is, signing with either name is acceptable to the county, but the DMV prefers you sign with your maiden name. Some brides who signed with their married name have had trouble at the DMV, when changing the name on their driver's license.

After your ceremony, mail the license back to the county and the county will return it to you a week or so later. For more information and to locate a County Clerk & Recorder's Office near you, go online and search for (county name) Colorado Marriage License.
